Awaiting each stitcher was a Stitcher's Hideaway Fun Pack filled with stash and goodies, and a wonderful gift bag from Lydia of Wyndham Needleworks. The Stitcher's Hideaway Fun Packs had donated items from Glory Bee, Calico Crossroads, Nordic Needle, Olde Willow Threads, Weeks Dye Works, Charles Craft, Just Nan, monsterbubbles, Kreinik, The Prairie Schooler, Rosewood Manor, Finger Work, and Mill Hill. Elizabeth Foster of Elizabeth's Designs also created a design just for the Sturbridge Stitcher's Hideaway stitchers.
