Stitchers Hideaway! 2007 in Sturbridge, MA Fun Report with Jeannette Douglas!



What a wonderful, wonderful, wonderful time we had at the Sturbridge retreat!!! There were FORTY of us there, plus the shop owners and our fantastic instructor, Jeannette Douglas of <u>Jeannette Douglas Designs</u>! This group came from California, Connecticut, Georgia, Idaho, Maine, Massachusetts, Minnesota, New Jersey, New York, Ohio, Pennsylvania, and Canada. What fun to see everyone after all the excited email exchanges over the previous months!

The retreat was held once again at the Publick House in Sturbridge, MA -- just about a mile from Old Sturbridge Village. There is a lot to see in the area and so many of the attendees worked in some additional vacation time to explore some of it.

Everyone was *very* eager for the retreat to begin! As soon as the doors were opened, they poured into the large classroom where they were immediately surrounded by stash, glorious stash!! Chris's Collection, <u>Olde</u> Colonial Designs, and Scandinavian Stitches had all set up shop for us. Wow!!



Everyone picked up their Fun Packs, and while some jumped right into shopping, others dove into the Fun Packs. Our first hour together was a mix of getting settled in the classroom, playing in the Fun Packs and shopping and shopping. Ahhhhh. Paradise!

Once we gathered for class, we discovered who traveled farthest -- Margaret from CA was the winner! But... she wouldn't have even attended if Denise from CA didn't tell her all about it, and the two of them live just 15 minutes away from each other. SO, for their loooong travel to Sturbridge they each received some special gifts. Woo-hoo! Here's Margaret and Denise (holding a door prize she received from It's Fine-ally Finished).

Now since I have mentioned Denise, let me tell you a little about her. Denise and I connected over the internet perhaps as long as 2 years ago while her husband was serving in Iraq. We exchanged a lot of email during that time. Thankfully, her husband returned home safe and sound and has since retired from military service. Denise had been longing to attend a retreat so once her husband returned, she finally made plans with Margaret. They made an extended vacation out of it and spent time in Boston, too. To the delight of many lucky stitchers, Denise brought along bottles of Wild Bunch wine to give away as door prizes! (Denise lives in wine country.) She has also created some designs for her local EGA and donated some of those for door prizes, too! What a sweetie. Thanks, Denise!

It was finally time to work on our gorgeous project, *Massachusetts - The Bay State*, designed for us by Jeannette Douglas. First, Jeannette showed us the finished sampler framed in two different ways. Wow, what an amazing difference in the overall impact of each one! We drooled, and some of us tried to make bargains with Jeannette to "free" her of having to transport the samplers back home, all to no avail. So, we got started on our own samplers by doing a bit of basting in preparation for the afternoon session. We all enjoyed listening to Jeannette's Canadian accent, ay?

After lunch, and more shopping (of course!), we began working on the flag banner across the top of the sampler, which sets the tone for the wonderful history that abounds in the State of Massachusetts. Next, we started working on the trail that runs down the middle of the sampler. This helped us to move from spot to spot to work on specialty stitches in different areas of our fabric. The trail represents the Mohawk and Freedom Trails, which connect in the middle to the Boston Common. The design was full of motifs and depictions of early New England, yet retained the land we've come to know now. A quote from Henry David Thoreau, the Concord born philosopher and author of *Walden*, which is a reflection upon simple living in natural surroundings, is used in this piece to reflect the stitcher's feeling of companionship that we share in our love of stitching. The sampler captures a bit of Cape Cod to the Berkshires. There is a New England church, chickadees (state bird), the Mayflower, tea party, an elm tree (state tree), colonial wallpaper motif, Nantucket baskets, corn, hats (pilgrim, witch, Paul Revere), a grist mill and sheep, Iroquois feather, an American Liberty quilt pattern,



stars, flag, maple leaf, Boston Harbor, the grasshopper weathervane on top of Faneuil Building (the Cradle of Liberty), shells, sand dunes, and water, old candlesticks, cranberries, apples, a lobster and cod (state fish), weaving (darning to represent the textile industry), a cape cod house, and so much more!

We worked away happily, breaking here and there for meals and shopping. The room we used at the Publick House is very large. We had roomy seating for everyone to stitch in comfort, plus room for all 3 shops to be set up -- along with all the goodies from Stitcher's Hideaway, too. At meal time we simply walked into an adjoining room, and wow, did we ever have some great meals! Every meal was buffet style so that we could pick and choose just what we would like out of their many yummy offerings. Some of us became a little addicted to the Publick House sticky buns! LOL! Everything was so yummy. Here's the menu from just one of our meals: Publick House Bakery Basket featuring Homemade Cheese Bread, Nut Bread, Corn Muffins and Sweet Rolls. Homemade Soup of the Day, New Potato Salad with Artichoke Hearts, Pancetta, Cured Olives, Capers and Fresh Dill. Grilled Asparagus, Mozzarella and Oven Dried Tomatoes. Tossed Spinach Salad with Bacon and Roasted Garlic. New England Seafood Pie, Herb Roasted Lemon Chicken, Rice Pilaf, Seasonal Vegetables, Deep Dish Apple Pie with Vermont Cheddar Cheese and Whipped Cream, Coffee and Decaffeinated Coffee, Assortment of Hot Teas. Now I bet just reading that is bringing back some delicious memories for the attendees!

Some of the stitches Jeannette taught us were Rhodes, Laisy Daisy, Leaf, Tied Oblong, Ray, Long Arm, Fly, Herringbone, Eyelet, Rice, Shell, Hungarian, Mosaic, Milanese, over one, Italian, Colonial Knot, Star, Woven, Herringbone, and Brick. It was amazing how much we covered in one retreat! Jeannette gave us great written instructions and diagrams to follow later when we continued working on the samplers on our own.

That afternoon we had a fantastic presentation by Jean Contino, Coordinator of Crafts and Households, and Rebecca Nourse, Collections Manager, at Old Sturbridge Village entited "From Corset to Cap: The Layers of Fashion" -- a talk about ladies' clothing from the 1830s! They used garments and accessories from the collection of Old Sturbridge Village to discuss the many layers of clothing worn by ladies of the early nineteenth century to create a fashionable figure. At that time, stylish ladies used these layers to achieve sloping shoulders, a narrow waist, full sleeves, and bell-shaped skirts. We saw undergarments (such as shifts, stays, busks, puffs, pockets, and petticoats) along with gowns and embroidered accessories! It was fascinating! Jean (pictured at left) was just a wealth of knowledge, answering question after question.

I must say that as I sat there in my capris and tshirt -- with a mere two articles of under-garments, I felt very grateful to be living in 2007!!


















It was a lot of fun to walk around and admire everyone's work!


