The first piece we worked on in class was the Whale Tail Scissor Fob. After we stitched the detailed whale tail, Amy taught us how to shape, fasten and sew our scissor fob using a lovely matching fabric for the back. She also provided each of us with charming sea creatures and beautiful hued floral beads, along with embroidery scissors for our fob!

The next project was the adorable crab pin keep. The design, in gorgeous red and orange threads with a sweet red heart, was a fun, quick stitch. Some folks even did versions of yellow and blue crabs, the latter being a nod to our local blue crab population. It was such fun to have two projects to take home completely finished!



Later that evening, we enjoyed a delicious meal of chicken parmigiana, risotto cakes, fresh salad from Coastal Caterers (Mystic Market) followed by delicious desserts. After supper, we retired back to our stitching room for a fun stitching exchange and door prizes! Our second day began with folks working on the Seaside Sampler which featured Mystic's own lighthouse. The blue hand-dyed linen was a lovely background for the bright white of the lighthouse. The alphabet design in alternating colors kept us all busy. For a splash of fun, a whale tail, colorful fish and a blue wool felt hydrangea rounded out the design







And, of course, we had a lot of fun joking around!

After a delicious lunch, Amy introduced the class to her frame painting technique using chalk paint. For this project, she used a base coat of light blue. Once dried, she applied a thin layer of off-white chalk paint which was also left to dry. Amy then used soft sandpaper to gently rub the chalk paint off the edges and scattered areas of the frame to give it a weathered look. The final touch involved taking a paint dauber and adding sand-colored dots artistically placed around the frame. We all looked forward to finishing our samplers and framing them in our own custom-made frames!
